





Witthöft Taught in China in the Summer




Hands-on Experience of Chinese Dragon Dance

Networking With Chinese Visiting Scholars at IUP






East Asia Night















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Latino Reception

HHC representatives (from left to right): Student Andrew Erway, Prof. Liza Valle, and Dr. Vicente Gomis-Izquierdo.




Noche Latina






Escénica Producciones Performed at IUP

Liu Receives 2014 Cengage Learning Award



Dr. Shijuan Liu received the 2014 Cengage Learning Award for Innovative Excellence in the Teaching of Chinese as a Foreign Language at the Annual Meeting of the Chinese Language Teachers Association (CLTA) held in San Antonio, November 21-23.

Established with the support of Cengage Learning, this award is designed to encourage CLTA members to contribute to the improvement of Chinese Foreign Language (CFL) education in the United States through the design, development, and application of new pedagogy, innovative classroom practices, and teaching tools. All K-16 teaching professionals with active CLTA member status are eligible to apply. There are more than 900 individual members and 100 institutional members as of 2014.

Dr. Liu's project is entitled "Content Based Instruction with Emerging Technology for a Mixed Level Postsecondary Chinese Language Class" in which she summarized her teaching of CHIN481 in the 2014 Spring semester.



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FACULTY RESEARCH


Dr. Eileen Glisan conducted a full-day workshop at the annual Convention of the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) held in November in San Antonio, Texas. The topic of the workshop was "Enhancing Instruction with Integrated Performance Assessment." She also served as the moderator of the Research Plenary, the topic of which was "Research Priorities--Phase II: Using Research to Move Language Education Forward." In addition, she was the moderator for one of the plenary follow-up sessions, "Foreign Language Teacher Preparation Models: Documentation, Implementation, and Outcomes." Dr. Glisan continues to serve as Co-director of the national Research Priorities in Language Education Project.

Dr. Vicente Gomis-Izquierdo published a paper in the journal *Letras Hispánicas* titled "Notas sobre la masculinidad en *Una cristiana* (1899) y *La prueba* (1899) de Emilia Pardo Bazán" in which he discusses the features of masculinity in 19th-Century Spain as they are represented in those two novels.

Dr. Shijuan Liu presented her work at the Inaugural conference (in May) and the Fall Symposium (in October) of the Chinese Language Teachers Association of Western Pennsylvania (CLTA-WPA) held at Carnegie Mellon University, Pittsburgh. In addition, Liu co-edited the *Proceedings of the 8th International Conference & Workshops on Technology & Chinese Language Teaching* (TCLT), held at Tufts University, Boston, June 2014, and conducted an invited workshop together with a high school Chinese language teacher on using tablets in K-16 classrooms at the TCLT conference.

Her paper entitled "Teaching Chinese language and culture with collaborative learning: Combining curricular and co-curricular activities through Chinese Spring Festival celebration" was published in the October issue of *Teaching Chinese in International Contexts*.

Dr. Heide Witthöft presented on "(Non)Person: Jean-Baptiste Grenouille's (Un)Real Existence" at the 2014 PAMLA Conference, October 31–November 2, 2014 in Riverside, CA. The paper was part of the session on *Homely, Unhomely, Uncanny: The Familiar and the Unfamiliar in German Literature and Culture.*

The 2014 IUP Spring Methodology Conference on Foreign Language Teaching was successfully held at Blairsville, PA, April 25.





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
The 2015 IUP Spring Methodology Conference



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
