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#### A NOTE FROM THE CHAIR



As we are counting the days to the end of the 2012-2013 academic year, the Department of Foreign Languages can count it as one of many impressive successes. We are in our first year of our newly launched graduate program in Spanish. We are in our second year of our full-time Chinese instruction, with strong enrollment. We

are in our first year of full-time Japanese instruction, also with strong enrollment. In this spring alone we have been very busy. Our new tenure-track Japanese faculty member, Dr. YongTaek Kim, has secured a \$25,000 grant from the Japan Foundation to provide additional Japanese instruction in the fall of 2013. The French faculty organized a presentation by two French diplomats, the Honorary Consul for the French Republic and the President of Consular Association of the French Republic, on "Why Learn French in the XXIst Century." Just last week we hosted the 24th Appalachian Language Educators Society Festival, bringing nearly 500 students, teachers and parents from throughout southwestern Pennsylvania to celebrate and promote foreign language instruction. These are only some of the many undertakings that we have been doing to serve our students, our institution, and the commonwealth of Pennsylvania. As the chair of the department, I am immensely proud of all the work that we do.




## **Our Students and Our Alumni**

Maurice Childs, a 2007 graduate of Spanish for International Trade, has been working in Spain since October 2011 as a North American Language and Culture Assistant. His main role is to serve as a Cultural Ambassador of the United States. He is currently teaching in two bilingual high schools. In the bilingual schools he teaches English and Spanish: "I have increased my Spanish proficiency tremendously! Living with Spanish roommates, hanging out with Spanish friends, and taking Salsa and Bachata dance lessons has allowed me to learn more than just the 'textbook' Spanish and develop a deeper understanding of the Spanish language and culture." His experience in Spain has led him to pursue a career in teaching. This fall 2013, he will be starting a two-year joint Master of Arts program at New York University. The program's title is: Teaching Spanish as a Foreign Language and Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages. The first year of the program he will be placed in Madrid, and the second year he will be in New York City. He is excited to begin the program as he states, "I believe this program will grant me access to the tools needed to make significant contributions within the field of foreign language education." He is ready to promote cross-cultural understanding in the class-



room. "I would like to thank IUP's Spanish department and professors for being the foundation of my career path. IUP is where I first fell in love with the Spanish language and Hispanic cultures. Thank you!"

Jovana Ramos, a Spanish BA major, presented a paper at IUP's Fourth Annual Undergraduate Scholars Forum held at the HUB on April 2, 2013. Her paper was titled "¿Qué Sabe la Mujer Sabia?: The Power of Knowledge in La Celestina and La Donzella Teodor."

**Hannah Frishberg,** a student from Chinese 102, attended the 4th "Chinese Bridge" East USA Chinese Language Proficiency Competition for College Students on March 17, 2013. The competition was held at Pace University, New York City.



Thirty students from more than 10 institutions attended the competition. Besides giving a short Chinese speech, each participant was also required to perform in the Chinese culture related talent show. The title of Hannah's speech is My First Chinese Qipao and Ping, the Duck. For her talent performance, Hannah played two Chinese folk music pieces with bassoon. As a finalist, Hannah is eligible to apply for a scholarship to study in China in 2014. The scholarship is funded by Hanban, the headquarters of the Confucius Institute in Beijing.

### **Faculty Presentations and Publications**

**Drs. P. Brooks, E. Glisan and J-L. Dassier** presented together at the 2012 Annual Convention of ACTFL in Philadelphia, PA on Friday, November 16. The title of their presentation was "Preparing Foreign Language Teachers: It Takes an Entire Educational Community!" The session was designed to assist program faculty at other universities in emulating a national recognized program, whose success relies on an entire educational community. Additionally, They co-produced a video program about Spanish/French Education. **Dr. Eileen Glisan** co-presented a session at the annual convention of the Modern Language Association held in January 2013 in Boston. The title of the session was "Establishing a Research Agenda: Connecting with the K-16 Language Classroom." The session presented the five national priority areas for research in foreign language education and details of the project's second research phase, planned for 2013–2014. Also, she gave an address to faculty and students in the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures at the University of Delaware as part of its Distinguished Scholar Series in March 2013. Her topic was "Crossing the Border: Helping Students Reach Advanced-Level Proficiency." Lastly, Dr. Glisan recently earned full recertification by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) as an Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) Tester of Spanish. Recertification is granted to those testers who complete a rigorous training process and demonstrate the ability to conduct and rate OPIs according to the criteria established by ACTFL. Dr. Glisan has been a certified OPI tester since 1986 and her current certification is valid until 2017.

**Dr. Christina Huhn** gave two presentations on second language writing. First, she presented "Writing in the Foreign Language Classroom: Beyond the Generic" in April 2012, in Blairsville, PA, at the IUP Methodology Conference. In November of 2012, she presented : The Writing Proficiency Guidelines: Evidence from a Department-wide assessment, at the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) annual conference in Philadelphia, PA. In fall of 2012, Dr. Huhn also presented a session entitled "Reflective practice for the post-secondary classroom," in September, 2012, at the West Virginia Foreign Language Teachers Association (WVFLTA) annual conference. Additionally, she presented her research on teaching strategies in West Virginia in a presentation entitled Learners Wanted: Strategies & Methods in WL Classrooms, in March of 2012, Atlanta, GA, Southern Conference on Language Teaching (SCOLT). An article on the same topic is forthcoming. In March of 2013, Dr. Huhn presented at the Northeast Conference on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (NECTFL), in Baltimore, MD. The presentation was entitled "Nuisance or Necessity: Personal Electronic Devices in the Classroom."



**Dr. Shijuan "Laurel" Liu** gave a presentation at the Annual Chinese Language Teachers Association held in Philadelphia, on November 2012. The title of her presentation was "Empirical Studies on Chinese Characters in CFL: A Review." She also gave a presentation on IUP's Technology Day (January 22, 2013) with Professor Jin Pang. The title of the presentation was "Apple iPads and Samsung Galaxy Tablets: A Comparison and Their Implications for Language Teaching and Learning." In addition, she received two internal grants in 2012-2013. The first grant was awarded by the Living Learning Community to support her research project entitled "Using Living Learning Community to Improve Students' Intercultural Competence with Technologies." The second grant was awarded by Academic Computing Policy Advisory Committee (ACPAC) to support her project entitled "Using Tablet Technology in Language Classrooms: Harnessing Its Potentials for Language Learning," which allowed her to purchase ten iPads for her Chinese language classrooms.

**Dr. Lydia Rodríguez** published, "La emoción como búsqueda de la sabiduría en *El Primero Sueño* de Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz (1651-1695)," (Emotion as Search for Wisdom in Sor Juana Ines de la Cruz's, 1651-1695, *First Dream*). The article analyzes Sor Juana's passion in her lengthy poem *First Dream* (*El Primero Sueño*). The *First Dream* exemplifies her quest of knowledge and enlightenment. The article was published in the journal *Mirabilia*, which is housed in la Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona.

**Dr. Heide Witthöft** presented "The Ultimate Outsider as Ultimate Insider: Jean-Baptiste Grenouille's Path to Becoming One with Society in Patrick Süskind's Das Parfum (The Perfume)" on March 8th at the 2013 Conference of the Society for Interdisciplinary Study of Social Imagery (SISSI) conference in Colorado Springs, Colorado. The paper focused on Jean-Baptiste Grenouille's outsider status on multiple levels: emotionally, physically, linguistically, olfactorily, professionally, intellectually, and morally. It analyzed how, despite social integration never being his ambition, in the end, Jean-Baptiste becomes one with society like few people ever do.

**Dr. Marjorie Zambrano-Paff** conducted two culinary demonstrations of Hispanic food for a crosscurricular project named "A Cultural Taste with a Healthy Zest" at Sewickley Academy for two sections of 9th grade Spanish classes. The presentations included a historical and cultural explanation of two particular dishes from Nicaragua and Costa Rica and a hands-on-experience activity where students got a chance to participate in a mock cooking class in Spanish. The presentation and demonstration took place on February 5th and 7th. In addition, She published the following article as a book chapter in the fall of 2012. "Mediated Humor in the Legal Setting: The Construction of New Identi



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Drs. Lydia Rodríguez and Francisco Alarcón (Department of Mathematics) interviewed 1992 Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Rigoberta Menchú Tum in December 2012. Rodriguez and Alarcón had the rare opportunity to sit down for an hour-and-a-half interview at Menchú Tum's home in Mixco, Guatemala.



The interview covered many topics ranging from the 13th Baktun to women, education and politics in Guatemala. Forthcoming articles about the interview are to follow.



Menchú Tum is an indigenous Guatemalan of the Quiché ethnic Mayan group. She received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1992, and in 1998 she was awarded the Prince of Asturias Award from Spain. Over the years, Menchú Tum has become widely known as a leading advocate of human rights of the indigenous people in Guatemala and in the Western Hemisphere as well as women's rights. Her work has earned her several international awards. Menchú Tum is an UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador. She has been awarded over 20 honorary degrees from various distinguished world universities.
